In his tenure at the IMA, Mark was responsible for the restoration of the Rapp Family Ravine Garden, Tanner Orchard and the Dickinson Four Seasons Garden. In 2009, the IMA's largest addition, the Virginia B. Fairbanks Art & Nature Park, opened under his tutelage.
